Banners were installed in the play area during the summer of 2020 informing the public of their responsibilities and the recommendations of the Parish Council.

* Washing of play equipment. It was felt impractical to instigate a washing regime for the play equipment as it would take only 1 infected visitor to be in the park for Covid 19 to be transferred to any furniture within this boundary. This could happen at any time and washing the play equipment once or twice a day would not necessarily eliminate this cross contamination. Any washing regime would be expensive for the council to fund. Signs have been put up asking responsible adults to ensure they wash children's hands or use hand sanitiser after using the equipment.

- * **Provision of hand sanitiser**. It was felt that any provision of hand sanitiser would be used very quickly, and replacements would be difficult and expensive to instigate. Signs have been put up asking responsible adults to ensure they wash children's hands or use hand sanitiser after using the equipment.
- * **One Way System**. The play park is aimed at small children and it was felt a one-way system would be complicated for them to use or understand. The play equipment has plenty of space between items and it was felt that any responsible adults would ensure social distancing guidelines were followed.
