Buckinghamshire Council have issued Purple Bags to help with additional waste. These can be collected from the Maids Moreton Community Building, Avenue Road Playing Fields, on a Tuesday Morning at the Community Cafe.

Alternatively, bags can be picked up from Buckingham Library. The Library's opening times can be found on their website: www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/libraries/information-about-local-library/buckingham-library/

Each household is entitled to have 1 purple bag which will be collected along with the general waste bin collection (green bin) every alternative week.

Any additional recyclable waste should be placed in a clear bag on top of the recycling bin (blue bin) on the appropriate collection day.

2 Parish Council Actions

In October, Tony Clarke stepped down from the Council as he was relocating. We thank him for his valuable contributions, especially on matters such as repairs and maintenance and wish him well for the future. We are pleased to welcome Simon Mallett, who was born and raised in the village, to the Council. As well as expertise on matters such as IT, Simon also bring extensive experience on planning matters, especially on traffic and highways.

We currently have a vacancy for a Parish Councillor. If you would like to know more, please come along to one of our meetings and/or make contact with us. Within the Council, we also have a range of working groups that are made up of a mix of Councillors and volunteers. If you are particularly interested in a specific aspect of our work and would like to assist us, please let us know.

At our last meeting, we reviewed our budget for next year. As for everyone, we face price rises in everything and regrettably, we shall have to make a small increase in our precept for the coming year.

3 Planning and Development

As many of you will know, Buckinghamshire Council is preparing a new, county-wide Local Plan, which should be adopted in 2027. We responded on the initial draft that covered policies and are awaiting the updated version that will include potential sites for development. We shall review and comment on this once it is available.

When the new local plan becomes live, we shall need to formally revise our Neighbourhood Plan to be fully consistent with the new Local Plan. If our Neighbourhood Plan postdates the approved Local Plan then it takes precedence on non-material planning decisions that affect the village.

Neither of the two recent Judicial Reviews were accepted by the judge, which means that work is likely to start on the Walnut Drive development in 2026. We are planning to undertake another traffic survey in the village during January so that we have an up-to-date baseline of traffic levels. This is an important aspect of the issues that the Walnut Drive application has to take into account.

4 Public Transport

Buckinghamshire Council is seeking our views on possible enhancements to the public transport serving our village.

MMPC would very much like to hear the thoughts of Maids Moreton residents on this topic, in particular how the current public transport available can be improved and, more specifically, routes, timings and frequency.

14 News from Buckingham Rugby Union Football Club

Season's greetings and Best Wishes to everybody in Maids Moreton from Buckingham Rugby Club. As the nights continue to draw in, the Autumn Internationals and the much-leaked budget may well be behind us, but fortunately, we are not yet halfway through our rugby season. The recent heavy rain continues to provide a challenge for our ground staff, with pitches unplayable on several occasions due to waterlogging - what a contrast from the heights of the summer when the ground needed watering to make it playable and enable the grass to grow.

Following the appointment of new coach Harrison Marshall in late October, the fortunes of Buckingham's Men's 1st XV have been transformed, winning their last 3 games in style. They now sit 5th in their league having won four out of 8 games played overall. Next up they play local rivals Bicester at home and Bletchley away, before a home game against 3rd placed Henley IIs prior to Christmas. They should maintain, if not improve their league position by the halfway point of the season. Meanwhile Buckingham Mitres (2nd XV) sit 6th in their league, with 4 wins from 6 played.

Buckingham Swans Greens (First XV) are 4th in the Championship having played 9 games, winning 6 and losing 3 away fixtures against the 3 teams above them, including Sale FC 1861, Cheltenham Tigers and West Park Leeds. Key fixtures in January include 2nd placed Cheltenham and 3rd placed West Park at home and 7th placed Lichfield away. Buckingham Swans Whites (2nd XV) sit top of their league after promotion last time out, having won 5 from 6, with their only loss away to 2nd placed West Bridgeford.

At Academy, Mini and Junior level, player numbers for both boys and girls continue to be strong across all age groups. The Minis festival held in late September went very well, yielding a profit and positive feedback from the visiting clubs.

Harper's Day, BRUFC's much loved annual charity event is set to be another amazing day of rugby fun and fundraising and will take place on Saturday 27th December.

All Maids Moreton residents will be very welcome.
